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## THOUGHTS FROM FR. DAVID



*"Well done, good and faithful servant." Matthew 25:21*

As I'm sure you're aware by now, I have stepped down as director of the retreat center and Bishop Boyea has granted me "Senior Status." This term, "Senior Status" shouldn't be confused with going into full retirement. I'm hardly ready for that. In his letter to me dated September 3rd, he wrote:

*"Clearly, your gifts and experience over these years are valuable. [Your retirement from SFRC] will allow you to find meaningful engagement as a senior priest, giving you a greater chance for participation in other projects.*

*"On behalf of all those you have nourished by Word and Sacrament, please accept my gratitude for your years of valued priestly ministry to the Diocese of Lansing which I know will continue, and most especially for the witness of Christ's presence you have provided at the retreat center and in your various ministerial endeavors and assignments over the years.*

*"I assure you of my personal prayer that you will continue to feed our people in a rich and fulfilling ministry as a senior priest, continuing to bring forth the presence of Christ, our Priest and Good Shepherd.*

*"With fraternal best wishes, Bishop Boyea."*

The senior years of a priest's ordained ministry are important for the completion and perfection of the priestly vocation. Most of us know of senior priests that have served for decades in ministry to this end. These canonical norms are intended to promote the value and dignity of the person as well as the importance of priestly ministry and the mission of the Church.

In accord with the Code of Canon Law, these norms propose that retirement from a diocesan appointment (i.e. my stepping down as director of the retreat center) does not imply an end to ministry. Upon retirement a priest enters into a time of life where the Spirit calls him to complete the ministry to which he has been called.

As for completing the ministry to which I have been called, I will focus now as director of the Institute for Spiritual Direction. This is with the full approval and affirmation of Bishop Boyea, who has provided me with a residence at the senior priest housing adjacent to the St. Francis Retreat Center. *continued...*
