THOUGHTS FROM FR. DAVID



What became abundantly clear to me at the graduation ceremony of our fifth cohort this past December 15th was the sense of purpose embraced by the graduates, students and alumni as a community united as one. ISD reinforces the reality of a purpose driven life. Our Pilgrim's Way of the Cross moves us toward that which is illuminated by the uncreated light of Christ, that which is otherwise unseen by the world. As St. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 4:18 *"Fix our eyes not on what is seen but what is unseen [for] ... what is unseen is eternal."* Speaking the truth in love, we grow to become

in every respect the body of Christ who is the head. As we celebrate five years of ministry together, we *"do not run aimlessly"* (1Cor 9:26). But rather we are sustained by the living waters, the Fountain of Life where we live and move and have our being.

From our first cohort that gathered in the Fall of 2016 to this fifth graduating cohort, which passed the torch on to the students of the 6th cohort, we grow stronger in our faith, overcoming the obstacles that challenge us, steadfast in the knowledge that the evil of darkness will not overcome.

In joy, some eighty of us strong gathered to celebrate our fifth anniversary milestone. My prayer is that we be sustained throughout 2022 by the Bread of Life as we continue to celebrate Christ's victory. *"The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it."* (John 1:5) Astonishingly, Jesus Christ gave us power to become children of God. And that is our profound mission *"to accompany others in their transforming relationship with Jesus Christ and his Church."* (ISD Mission)

Change, Grace and Growth at the ISD

The last few months have been a time of great excitement at ISD and I wanted to fill everybody in on some of the recent happenings. In early September, Fr. David Rosenberg requested that he be moved to senior status as a priest in the Diocese of Lansing. Priests who reach a certain age are allowed to request senior priest status and Bishop Boyea granted this request in early September, with his strong encouragement and support. Senior priests are then able to pursue other projects that will serve the Kingdom of God.

This meant that he was no longer the director of the St. Francis Retreat Center and he was free to put more energy into other projects, including the Institute for Spiritual Direction.

Such a change, even one that is very positive like this one, can create confusion in the short run and some of you may have experienced that. Now, four months later, things are settling down and the blessings of God are evident.

As the ISD moves ahead with greater vision and inspiration than ever, we will be talking about some of these positive changes in the newsletter and on the website. Keep your eyes on the ISD web site to see some of these events in more detail.

For now, here is a short list of some of the blessings we are experiencing:

- The ISD executive council is taking more responsibility for various ongoing areas of concern in the ISD
- A new building has been obtained very near to the retreat house that will be used for ISD offices and meeting rooms.
- Work is underway to allow the ISD curriculum to be accredited. Graduates will be grandfathered in.
- New projects are being developed where the ISD will offer support to parishes in the diocese, with the idea of providing resources for building small communities within the parish.
- We are looking for more facilities that we can use to lessen the heavy impact of ISD on the retreat center. One example of this was the use of St. Jude's parish for the graduation ceremony in December. ISD was generously welcomed to this beautiful facility.
